#### **Urban Rural Rides Request**

#### Reimbursement of funds

The Commission received an email from the Northwest Regional Service Commission (Region 1) explaining that a refund of \$22,535 from Circular Materials for the Western Valley Rural District's carts will be sent to the Commission to be held for future use on the Rural District's Solid Waste budget.

### Letter from Hartland Re: Regional Appeals Committee

Katelyn read a letter received from Hartland supporting the implementation of a regional appeals committee for dangerous and unsightly properties, similar to the composition of the existing PRAC committee.

Staff will explore this option for another shared service and report on findings at the October Board meeting.

Communities that do not employ a full-time By-law Enforcement Officer wish the Commission to explore this as a shared service, as well. Staff will gather costs and contact other regions that provide this service to their member communities. A report will follow when all the information is gathered.

#### **Al Training Opportunity**

Katelyn asked the Board if they were interested in Al training for them and their staff. All agreed that it would be a great initiative as it is affecting all of us in our personal and professional lives. The Board agreed that this would be beneficial for municipal staff.

#### **Draft Budget**

The Board went through the draft 2026 budget once again and asked for departmental reports before voting on it.

The Board will meet again on Tuesday, September 23 at noon to hear the reports and go over the budget again. After this the Board will attend a meeting with the Minister of Public Safety at 3:00 p.m.

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At 10:15 am, the CAOs joined the meeting to hear the presentation from Derron Merriweather, Tim Smith and Rany McLean from J.S. Bellis regarding the potential changes to the collection schedules for mid-year of 2026.

After the presentation, the CAOs left, and the Board resumed their meeting.
